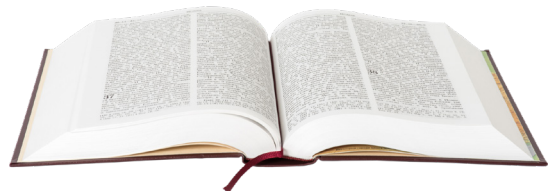

Pastor

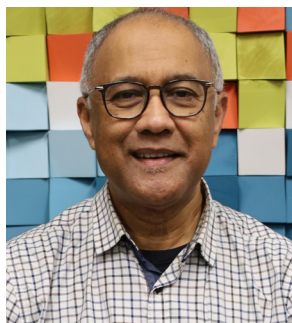

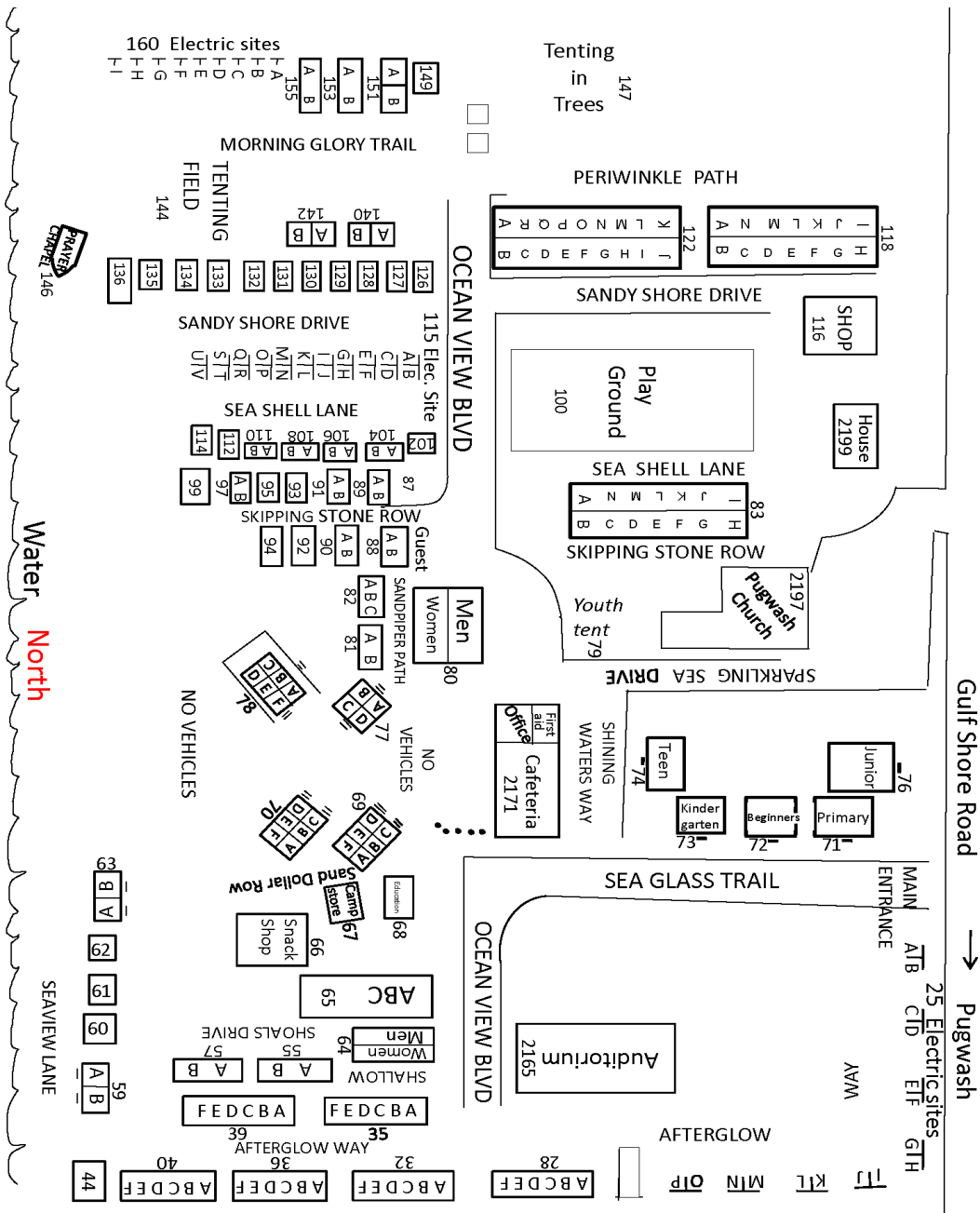

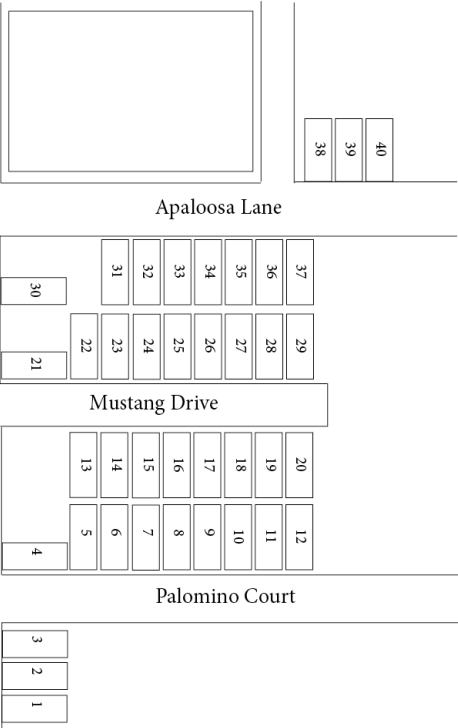
Growing God's Family Campground Map

SNACK SHOP

AIR CONDITIONERS	Use of air conditioners in cabins/trailers puts a strain on the electrical system. An additional charge of \$30.00 for use during campmeeting time.
SNACK SHOP	All profits for the snack shop will go to the Education Department of the Maritime Conference. Thank you for your support!
CONDUCT	As a spiritual retreat for Christians, the use of tobacco, alcohol and harmful drugs on the campground is prohibited. Christian deportment will enhance the campmeeting experience for each one attending.
FIRST AID	Our first aid service is for the summer camp, with limited exceptions in emergency cases. We recommend you bring your own first aid supplies or use the local hospital for treatment.
GROUPS CLOSED & QUIET TIME	The campgrounds close at 11:00 pm and open at 6:00 am. In consideration for those who are sleeping, quiet time is from 11:00 pm to 6:00 am.
KEY DEPOSIT	A \$10 per key CASH deposit is required at check-in for barracks, youth cabins, and division building keys. The deposit will be refunded when you return your key(s) prior to departure.
LOST & FOUND	The lost and found, for valuable items only, is located at the Camp Office. Toiletries, etc., left in the washrooms, will be placed in a box in the area where they are found for you to retrieve them.
PETS	Pets should remain at home or at a kennel. If pets are brought on the campgrounds, Pugwash has a STRICT PET POLICY which is enforced. Every pet/dog owner/sitter must sign an agreement contract and obtain pet tags during registration at the camp office. Charge of \$26 per unit/trailer/cabin/tent.
PLAYGROUND	Parents are expected to supervise their children at the playground. The playground is not designed for adults. Playground closes 15 min. after the youth tent afterglow is over.
RECORDINGS/DOWNLOADS	We will no longer be offering for sale CD/MP3 recordings of campmeeting sermons. They will be available after campmeeting for download on the Conference website at www.maritimesda.com .
FRENCH RADIO	Listen to the French translation of the live auditorium presentations on FM 91.3.
SAFETY	Fire and electrical safety must be FIRST in all of our minds. No live fires in cabins. No more than 2 (two) electrical items per outlet.
SUPERVISION	Parents/guardians are responsible, at all times, for their children. No one under 18 years of age may be registered at a campsite without adult presence throughout the week.
CAMP OFFICE	Located on the east side of the cafeteria. We will be open Friday July 22 after lunch (closed during supper) to serve you. Please register at the camp office upon arrival at the campground, especially if you are new or have a pet. Those requesting tenting sites (especially sites with electricity) need to check in before they set up their site. Grandfathered and seasonal renters or those who have paid in full, can come in Sunday. Please display your vehicle tag upon arrival. Check out time is 11:00 am.
VEHICLE TAG	Every vehicle on the campgrounds needs to be registered and display a vehicle tag.
WASHROOMS CLOSED FOR CLEANING	The washrooms will be closed for cleaning during the hours of 9:30-10:30 AM and 11:00 PM- MIDNIGHT. Please ensure you make plans to around these times. It would help our staff and volunteers greatly if we each did our part in keeping the washrooms clean by picking up and tidying after ourselves and friends.
GARBAGE, RECYCLING & COMPOST	All garbage should go in clear bags and must be placed in the garbage barrels. Recycling should be placed in the blue recycling barrels. All compost should be placed in the buckets provided for slop and will be picked up each evening.
